Field Mentor Assessment of the Field Practice Program

The goal of the Collaborative Health and Human Services program is to prepare graduates for entry level work in health and human services professional positions. Field practice engages students in supervised professional entry – level work and provides opportunities to apply classroom learning in the field. Field practice consists of a mentoring team: the CHHS student, the agency Field Mentor, and the CHHS Field Program Coordinator and provides a link between the university and the community.

The Collaborative Health and Human Services Field Program (CSUMB) requires students to participate in a placement for interprofessional education in a variety of settings, all of which provide a collaborative experience. Concurrently they attend field seminars and classes on campus to focus on interprofessional education, professional development, and theory in their concentration fields.
